IU Email Account

The IU email account is now the primary method of communication and is required for all adjunct and affiliate faculty.

Once your faculty paperwork has been processed, you will receive an email from the Dean that includes instructions on how to set up your IU email account.

The IU email account can be used within Outlook Web Access (<u>uits.iu.edu/exchange</u>) or with your Outlook client via Microsoft Exchange.

Note that the IU email account (iu.edu) is different than the IU Health (iuhealth.org) email address.

Crimson Card | Indiana University Identification Card crimsoncard.iu.edu

CrimsonCard is the official photo ID card for all Indiana University campuses, available to IU students, faculty, and staff. Through the Deal of the Day and CrimsonPerks programs, you can receive a discount when you pay with or present your CrimsonCard at certain retail locations (e.g., restaurants, cell phone service, travel, etc.).

Discounts aren't available on all campuses, but you can access these regardless of your primary campus.

Ruth Lilly Medical Library was established in 1908 and is the state's largest academic health sciences library. It is the primary information resource for faculty, students, and staff. The library and its staff work across all nine campuses providing a collaborative learning environment and access to information resources, including online journals.

3. IU SPONSORED SOFTWARE AND PROGRAMS

IUanyWare | IU-licensed apps and software uits.iu.edu/iuanyware

IUanyWare allows you to run certain IU-licensed software applications that you do not use on a regular basis, without having to install them on your computer. This includes products from:

- Adobe (Acrobat, Creative Suite, etc.)
- Microsoft Office 365 (Office applications are available for download by request)
- statistical packages (SPSS, Minitab, etc.)
- and others.

OneDrive | Free Cloud Storage old.uits.iu.edu/onedrive

Microsoft OneDrive at IU (aka OneDrive for Business) is a cloud storage service with Office 365. OneDrive offers 5TB of storage to store, share, and sync files. View and update documents saved in the cloud using OneDrive from just about anywhere. Sync OneDrive files on Windows, macOS, iPhone and iPad, and Android. Open and edit OneDrive documents directly in Office Online. Edits are saved automatically in real time so you can collaborate with others.

Adjunct and affiliate faculty will use MedHub to verify medical students' required clinical experiences and to complete assigned course or clerkship evaluations of learners on time so grades can be assigned.

- Evaluations are due within 2 business days of your time working with the student ends.
- Report any deficiency in a student's performance to the clerkship or course director as soon as it is detected to ensure that the student has an opportunity to improve their performance.

Canvas | A Learning Management System canvas.iu.edu

Know the goals, objectives, and evaluation criteria for the course or clerkship you are teaching to provide an optimal learning experience for the student. If you have trouble accessing a course, contact your clerkship coordinator, course coordinator, or campus education coordinator.

Access to most IU services requires a central authentication service (CAS) login. Logins for CAS require two-step authentication using Duo, requiring enrollment for a mobile device or another phone number to verify authentication.
